

HMSA would like to share with you the following information received from the Healthcare Association of Hawaii regarding the availability of COVID-19 vaccinations for health care workers.

A number of hospitals across the state have agreed to be COVID-19 vaccination hubs for healthcare workers. Every zip code in the state had been mapped to one of these hospital vaccination hubs. The list of zip codes by hospital is in the attached file, based on practice location. There is one tab per county in the attached Excel file.

If a healthcare provider has not already been in touch with an affiliated hospital, long term care provider, or FQHC, regarding getting vaccinated, that provider should fill out the survey at the following link <a href="https://health.hawaii.gov/coronavirusdisease2019/for-clinicians/covid-19-vaccine/">https://health.hawaii.gov/coronavirusdisease2019/for-clinicians/covid-19-vaccine/</a> to provide contact information for themselves and their staff. The information collected via this survey will be sent to the respective hospital, who will reach out to individuals to schedule their vaccinations. This process has already started, and we anticipate that every healthcare worker and their staff will have the opportunity to receive their initial COVID-19 vaccine during the month of January, with the booster shots being administered approximately 21 days later. The Pfizer vaccine is the vaccine being used by hospitals for healthcare workers.

Independent healthcare practices should complete this survey to provide information on their COVID-19 vaccination needs. [...]

This process applies for any healthcare provider who bills insurers for their services, and for their staff.

Community care homes and foster homes are being handled through a separate process, and further details will be forthcoming.

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If a healthcare provider has Kaiser Permanente for health insurance, and the provider and staff prefer to have their vaccines administered via Kaiser, they can call (808) 432-2000, Monday - Friday: 8am - 5pm, to schedule a vaccination appointment at Kaiser's Honolulu or Waipio clinic.
